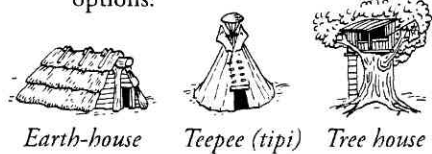



## 12 tasks in the square:

- 1 We are in the Old Town Hall. A dwelling originating from the time when the Hussite town was founded was exposed on this site. What did it look like, what do you think? Pick one of the three options!



Earth-house Teepee (tipi) Tree house

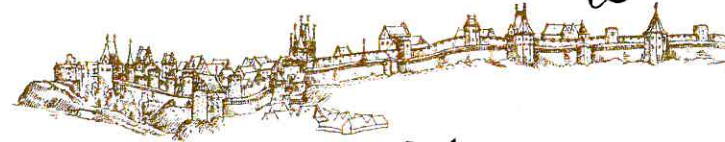
- 2 A clock used to be placed on the middle gable of today's museum building. The clock has 24 figures and one hand. But where is the clock now? Look around and pick the right answer!
- On a TV transmitter
  - On the town hall tower
  - On a pub
- 3 The small shop on the corner of the town hall features unusual decorations. Count up the blossoms! And do you know what the animals on the façade are called?
- 4 The Škoch House has a decorated gable. Look at it carefully and guess what the decorations are called.
- Cats' backs
  - Flies' backs
  - Donkeys' backs

- 5 Look down! There is a map of the square in the paving. What is marked with the red paving stones?
- The last campaign of Hussite troops
  - The route along the underground tunnels
  - The route from one pub to another
- 6 A Hussite troop is painted on the Golden Lion (U Zlatého Lva) house. Can you find a pavise and draw it? You probably know that a pavise is a high wooden shield which could cover almost the whole warrior.

- 7 The knight standing on top of the fountain is called Koudelka. Run around the fountain three times and watch out! The dolphins look rather dangerous!
- 8 The statue of Jan Žižka is placed on a pedestal. There is a date written in Roman digits. Can you read it? A little prompt – M = 1000, D = 500, C = 100, L = 50, X = 10, V = 5, I = 1.

- 9 The church was first built of wood, and therefore, the aforementioned Aeneas Silvius claimed that it looked like a barn. Finish the picture of a new stone church from 1602 after it had been damaged by fire. You can employ your imagination a bit.



- 10 The municipal authority has its seat in a building commissioned by the Savings Bank. Look carefully at the front door and identify what the angels surrounding the door are holding. Write down at least three kinds of tools you find there.

  - Feathers

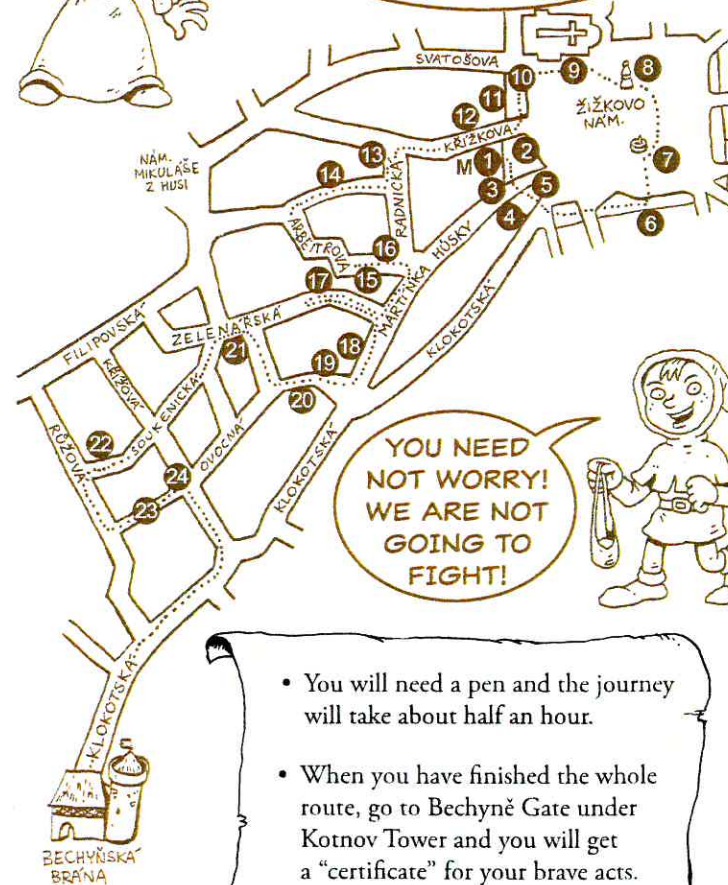

- You will need a pen and the journey will take about half an hour.
- When you have finished the whole route, go to Bechyně Gate under Kotnov Tower and you will get a "certificate" for your brave acts.
- After that, you become one of Tábor people. Italian writer Aeneas Silvius wrote in 1451 that Tábor people were rough and tough, frequently without eyes or hands.

## 12 tasks in streets

- 13 The Čadil house is famous as a horse butcher's shop, however, first the house was used as a municipal prison and subsequently as a pub. Would you guess the name of the pub?
- In paradise
  - In purgatory
  - In the hotel
- 14 This street is so narrow that if you walk with your arms stretched sideways you can touch houses on both sides at a time at least once. Try it!
- 15 There used to be a noisy taproom on this site (house no. 56) where quarrels and brawls frequently took place. These days are only commemorated by drawings on the house front. Can you copy them?
- 16 There is a boundary-stone! It protected the house corner from cart wheels. Car tires are not so dangerous any more. Look carefully and you can find at least 10 boundary stones! Make a tick for every boundary-stone you meet!
- BOUNDARY STONES:
- Apple tree
  - Coconut tree
  - Walnut tree
- 17 This detour via Zelenářská Street will bring you to a spot where dogs and bucks decorate the house gable and a sweet smell comes from a mysterious garden hidden behind a wall on the opposite side. Can you recognize the fruit tree in the garden?
- 18 A music school is located in a house with the sign MĚSTSKÝ HUDEBNÍ ÚSTAV (Municipal Music Institute). Would you guess why it was called a 'large apartment building' when it was built more than a hundred years ago?
- Because of high rent
  - Because of its size – other houses were smaller at that time
- 19 The Blue Rose (Modrá Růže) restaurant has a coat of arms with roses next to the front door. Their number will disclose to you what dynasty they are linked with:
- The Kolowrats – 2 roses
  - The Vitkovecs – 3 roses
  - The Luxembourgs – 4 roses
- 20 Can you see the small door by the ground? It is obviously not intended for people. Draw who the door is waiting for!
- 21 This house (no. 69) was called the coffin house because there used to be a joiner's shop and a coffin store one hundred years ago. There are no coffins any more; so try to draw one.
- 22 The smallest garden in Tábor! Pick its shape.
- Square
  - Rectangle
  - Triangle
- 23 This mouse hole leads to Ovocná Street. Squeeze through it to the other side.
- 24 This is the second fountain we have met. There are as many as 7 of them in the Old Town, but do not look for them now and hurry up to Kotnov to pick up your certificate!\*
- \* The ticket office in Kotnov and Bechyňská Gate is open 9am – 5pm from Easter till September. October – Easter you need to return back to the museum in the Old Town Hall to pick up your certificate.
